

Michigan School Meals

- Fiscal Year 2024 State School Aid Budget included Sec. 30d Universal School Meals
- Meals can be served at no cost to students
- State-Funded Reimbursement Program
- Thank you to the American Heart Association, No Kid Hungry Michigan, the School Nutrition Association of Michigan, the state legislature and Executive Office of Governor Gretchen Whitmer
- Starts with 2023-2024 school year







What is Eligible for Michigan School Meals Reimbursement?

- Meals served in public school districts, public school academies and intermediate school districts
- Meals served to students in:
 - · Kindergarten to Grade 12
 - Pre-Kindergarten Great Start Readiness Program (GRSP) or tuition-based
 4-year-old preschool classrooms
 - Special Education programs up to age 26
- · One breakfast and one lunch per student per day





What is Not Eligible for Michigan School Meals Reimbursement?

- Meals served in Nonpublic Schools
- Meals served in GSRP or other preschool programs that are part of Community Based Organization (CBO)
- · Meals served to children age 3 and under
 - Starting with SY 2023-2024 meals for children age 3 and under must be claimed in Child and Adult Care Food Program
- · Meals served to volunteers, teachers, and staff
- A la carte and second meals





What are the Michigan School Meals Program Requirements for Participation?

Program requirements include but are not limited to:

- Must participate in both National School Lunch and School Breakfast Program
- · Adopt Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) to maximize federal reimbursement
- · Collect relevant family income information
 - Application for Summer EBT and Education Benefit form for Michigan School Meals (traditional F/RP/P schools)
 - Education Benefits Form (CEP schools)
- · Write off all outstanding student meal debt
 - · Separate funding is available to assist
- Program Participation is optional for sponsors





What are the Michigan School Meals Program Recommendations for Participation?

- Participating sponsors are encouraged to offer meals that meet students' dietary restrictions, including:
 - The provision of gluten-free meals, vegetarian meals, vegan meals
 - Upon request, kosher meals, halal meals
 - Meals meeting any allergy restrictions as confirmed by a doctor's note





Education Benefits: What are they for? District Reporting

- Local education agencies are required to report student eligibility data in order to receive certain federal and state funds.
- MSDS Collections that require SNE include the Fall, Spring, and End of Year General Collections.
- Following are some of these uses:
 - Section 31a & Title I allocations and grant awards
 - E-Rate
 - Perkins Core Performance Indicators
 - School Index and Parent Transparency Dashboard
 - Graduation and Dropout Rates
 - · Great Start Readiness Program
 - School Nutrition Programs
 - Summer EBT



What is the Application for Summer EBT and Education Benefits?

- Who?
 - Any school that claims meals based on free, reduced-price, and paid student benefits.
- What?
 - Application for Summer EBT and Education Benefits (formerly School Meals Applications and Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application)
- Where?
 - The Michigan School Meals program website.
- When?
 - After July 1 each year, before the start of the school year.
- How?
 - Online, paper application, or a combination of both.
- Why?
- school meals.
- · Education benefits provided to the district, individual
 - school building, or household






What is the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Education Benefits Form?

- Who?
 - Any school that participates in CEP.
- What?
 - Education Benefits Form (formerly the Household Information Report)
- Where?
 - The <u>CEP Forms and Resources page</u> and <u>Michigan School Meals</u> program website.
- When?
 - After July 1 each year, before the start of the school year.
- How
 - Online, paper form, or a combination of both.
- Why?

Let's Recap on the Applications and Forms

- · Applications or Forms are not required to receive school meals
- May strongly encourage families to complete the applications or forms
- May use incentives if the Nonprofit School Food Service Account is not paying
- Must run Direct Certification reports





What is the 31k Grant Funding for Student Meal Debt Forgiveness?


- · Required for opting into Michigan School Meals
- · Application is open
- For School Year 2023-2024 only
- \$2.5 Million to reimburse districts for forgiving <u>current</u> student meal debt
- Districts must apply by October 1, 2023
- To be eligible for grant payments districts must:
 - · Adopt meal charge polices that prevent all forms of lunch shaming
 - · Write off current student meal debt with a transfer from the General Fund
 - Not be a previous awardee of a 31k grant in SY 2020-2021
